Dear Parents,

The month of January is quickly speeding by! The months seem to have flashed by us and it is amazing to think that grade 2 is almost halfway over!

In order to preserve these memories and take a snapshot of your child's extraordinary imagination at this age, we are going to be working on a class book. This is going to involve your child taking home our dinosaur friend, Dino-mite, and spending some time with him. Your child will be documenting his/her experiences with Dino-mite in the class book provided on the day that they take him home. They will have 3 days with Dino-mite, so they must make the most of their time! I welcome photos of your child with Dino-mite whilst they do the activities being written about. They might wish to indicate some of Dino-mite's favorite things as they learn more about him through play. For example, "Dino-mite loved to drink tea with his pinky out. He is a very fancy dinosaur." Or "Dino-mite snuggled me close because he was afraid of the dark." Their imaginations can fly sky high!

I have attached samples of some writing from last year that you can use as a guide. I will discuss my expectations with the class as well but, for your own information:

- A minimum of I page of writing and maximum of 2 pages of writing
- A drawing or photos that complement the written work
- An organized, detailed piece of writing that details the adventures that your child had with Dino-mite. Writing should be fluent, have juicy words (adjectives) and appropriate grammar (punctuation, capitalization etc.).
- A clear title, your child's full name and the date that they had their houseguests
- Neat, clear printing with appropriate spacing. Care should be taken to present their work in a way that is pleasing to the reader.
- The writing must be done WHILE your child has the dinosaur and the journal must be returned on the last day (otherwise it will cut into the next child's time)

Please do your best to remind your child about proper care for Dino-mite. We will be doing our best to ensure that he stays as pristine as possible. I understand that, as he is a stuffed toy, there is a chance that he could become soiled or lost. If this does happen during your visit, kindly get a replacement from Ikea before your time is up so that the next student will have their full visit with him. I believe that the total cost was 30AED.
